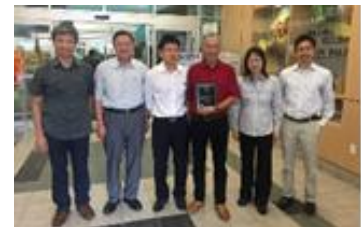
• Convention VIP Reception and Dinner Banquet
