The 27th CIE / USA-DFW International Technology Symposium was successfully concluded at the Renaissance Dallas Richardson Hotel on August 27th with nearly 400 participants. The theme of this year's conference was "Smart City and Smart Life - Technology, Manufacturing, Operations and Services for the Tomorrow Land."

CIE/USA-DFW was proud to have 3 guests of honor as keynote speakers at the symposium: (1) Dr. Tien-Yin Zhou, Director of Geographic Information Systems Research Center of Feng Chia University in Taiwan, (2) Michael Quinn, Vice President and Chief Technology Officer of Oncor Electric Delivery, and (3) David Kang, Vice President of Strategy Financial Services Division, Capital One.

Various experts from the fields, such as Texas Instruments, Orchestra Technology, AT&T, Toyota, BNSF Railway, University of Texas in Arlington, and City of Dallas discussed the current emerging trends to transition into a Smart City and how these technologies affect people today in the three parallel tracks (1) Smart home platform and sensor system, (2) Smart city, Smart manufacturing and automation technology, and (3) Leadership and career development. The participants responded enthusiastically to the speeches of these experts, and actively engaged with the presenters during the panel session.
